I 0900 – 1100	Asset protection and trusts
II 1100 – 1300	Non-charitable purpose trusts: the beneficiary principle; the differing models across the offshore world (in particular, Cayman Islands' STAR trusts)

III 0900 – 1100	Attenuating trustee duty of supervision: anti- <i>Bartlett</i> clauses and British Virgin Islands' VISTA trusts

X 1100 – 1300	Aspects of trustee duties as to administration of trust: management and investment of trust property; delegation and agency; claims on behalf of a trust; third party claims to trust assets; no contest provisions; applications for construction, court directions or approval and surrender of trustee discretion

SUNDAY 3: 06/10/24	
XI 0900 – 1100	Removal and appointment of trustees and beneficiaries
XII 1100 – 1300	Trustee liability for breach of trust: defining breach of trust; measuring and compensating loss (including the problem of reflective loss); exclusion of liability; defences and attribution of loss to beneficiaries; limitation periods for claim against trustee
XIII 1400 – 1600	Trustee entitlement to fees, costs and indemnities in the administration of a trust
