

UQ Law Leadership, Excellence and Diversity (LEAD) Scholarship FAQ's 2022/23

The below scenarios have been drafted to help students who are commencing an LLB (Hons) in 2023 and wish to apply for the LEAD Scholarship. Scholarships are awarded at the discretion of the TC Beirne Law School. Further eligibility criteria may apply.

I graduated my schooling in 2020, can I apply?

Yes. Students who have completed their senior schooling in Australia and graduated in either 2020, 2021 or 2022 can apply for the LEAD Scholarship, providing they intend to commence or continue a Bachelor of Laws (Honours), including dual programs, in 2023.

I am already studying a bachelor's degree, but am hoping to transfer to an LLB(Hons) in 2023, can I apply?

Yes. Providing you have not yet completed any prior bachelor level tertiary study or higher, you can apply for the LEAD Scholarship.

You must **still fulfill all other eligibility criteria** including:

- Have graduated from senior schooling in Australia within two years of your application (for studies in 2023, this means you must have graduated schooling in either 2020, 2021 or 2022).
- be able to display current and ongoing educational, social and/or financial disadvantage.
- be accepted into a Bachelor of Laws (Honours) or dual program at UQ.

I am a current law student at UQ, but I didn't know about this Scholarship when I started. Can I apply now?

Yes. If you have already commenced your studies with UQ Law, but did not apply in your first year, you can now apply for the LEAD Scholarship for your subsequent years.

Please note, you must **still fulfill all other eligibility criteria** including:

- have graduated from senior schooling in Australia within two years of your application (for studies in 2023, this means you must have graduated schooling in either 2021, 2021 and 2022).
- be able to display current and ongoing educational, social and/or financial disadvantage.

I am a current law student at another institution, but I want to transfer to UQ. Can I apply for this scholarship?

Yes. If you have already commenced your studies in law at another institution, you can now apply for the LEAD Scholarship alongside your application to transfer into a Bachelor of Laws (Honours) or dual program at UQ.

Please note, you must **still fulfill all other eligibility criteria** including:

- have not completed any bachelor level or higher program
- have graduated from senior schooling in Australia within two years of your application (for studies in 2023, this means you must have graduated schooling in either 2021, 2021 and 2022).
- be able to display current and ongoing educational, social and/or financial disadvantage.
- your scholarship eligibility will be conditional on you receiving an offer to study in an approved Bachelor of Laws (Honours) or dual program at UQ

I am about to apply for UQ Law as a mature age student, can I apply?

No. Unfortunately the LEAD Scholarship is designed for recent school leavers (up to two years post senior schooling). There are a number of other Bachelor of Laws based scholarships you may wish to apply for. Please check the scholarships website for further information.
