

# GENEVA PROGRAM 2023

Teaching weeks 2<sup>nd</sup> -21<sup>st</sup> July 2023

**At Centre International Réformé John Knox, Geneva, Switzerland.**

We are now calling for applications to attend this exciting program in International Human Rights Law, which will be taught in Geneva next July.

While the teaching runs for three weeks in July, please note that these are units which are run in a teaching period that requires you to complete assignments by the middle of semester two.

## The Program

There will be three units offered

- LLB337 Legal Protection of International Human Rights (3pt);
- LLB376 International Human Rights Organisations (3pts).
- LLB327 Refugee Law (3pts);

The first two units will be taught from the 3<sup>rd</sup>-14<sup>th</sup>, while Refugee Law will be taught in the final week of the program.

You can enrol in one, two or three units, for a maximum of 9 credit points.

***Please note that if you wish to apply for OSHelp, you must be enrolled in all three.***

To be considered for the program, you must as have completed as a pre-requisite:

- LLB358 Australian Administrative Law; and
- LLB259 Constitutional Law.

## The Costs

While we try to keep costs at a minimum, the costs for the program is between 2,000 and 2,500 for the three weeks. (If you would like your own room the cost is higher). We will finalise the costs and notify you of them as soon as we can along with the method of payment.

This cost per person is for a shared double room at the Centre International Réformé John Knox with shower and WC and includes breakfast. Lunches will be provided on teaching days and networking events/dinners during the program as well as entry fees to the UN, other organizations and site visits.

***Students will need to organise their own flights to Switzerland at their own expense.***

Geneva is an international diplomatic city and costs are higher than in Perth. While breakfast every day and lunch on teaching days will be included in the price of accommodation, other meals must be paid for by students.

### **The Experience**

This program is a unique opportunity to really experience international human rights law in action. We will take you to the UN and many other organisations including NGOs to speak with practitioners and really understand how they work. We have a range of guest speakers who will share their experiences of working within the Human Rights framework.
